

# Using the Suffix 'ed'



# Aim

- To be able to use 'ed' to change words into the past tense.

# Success Criteria

- I can add 'ed' to a word to change it to past tense.
- I can find words that need 'ed' on the end to make them past tense.

When we write in the past tense, we add  
**'ed'** to most verbs.



Here is an easy  
way to help you  
remember  
this...

Uncle Ed is very old.

He likes to remember things that happened in the past.

With most verbs, we can add Uncle Ed's name to change the verb to the past tense.



I walked in the park.

We added 'ed' to walk because Uncle Ed did this in the past!

I poured **ed** the milk on my cereal.



We added '**ed**' to pour because Uncle Ed did this in the past!

I talked **ed** to my friend Bert.



We added '**ed**' to talk because Uncle Ed did this in the past!

I **played** football.

We added '**ed**' to play because Uncle Ed did this in the past!

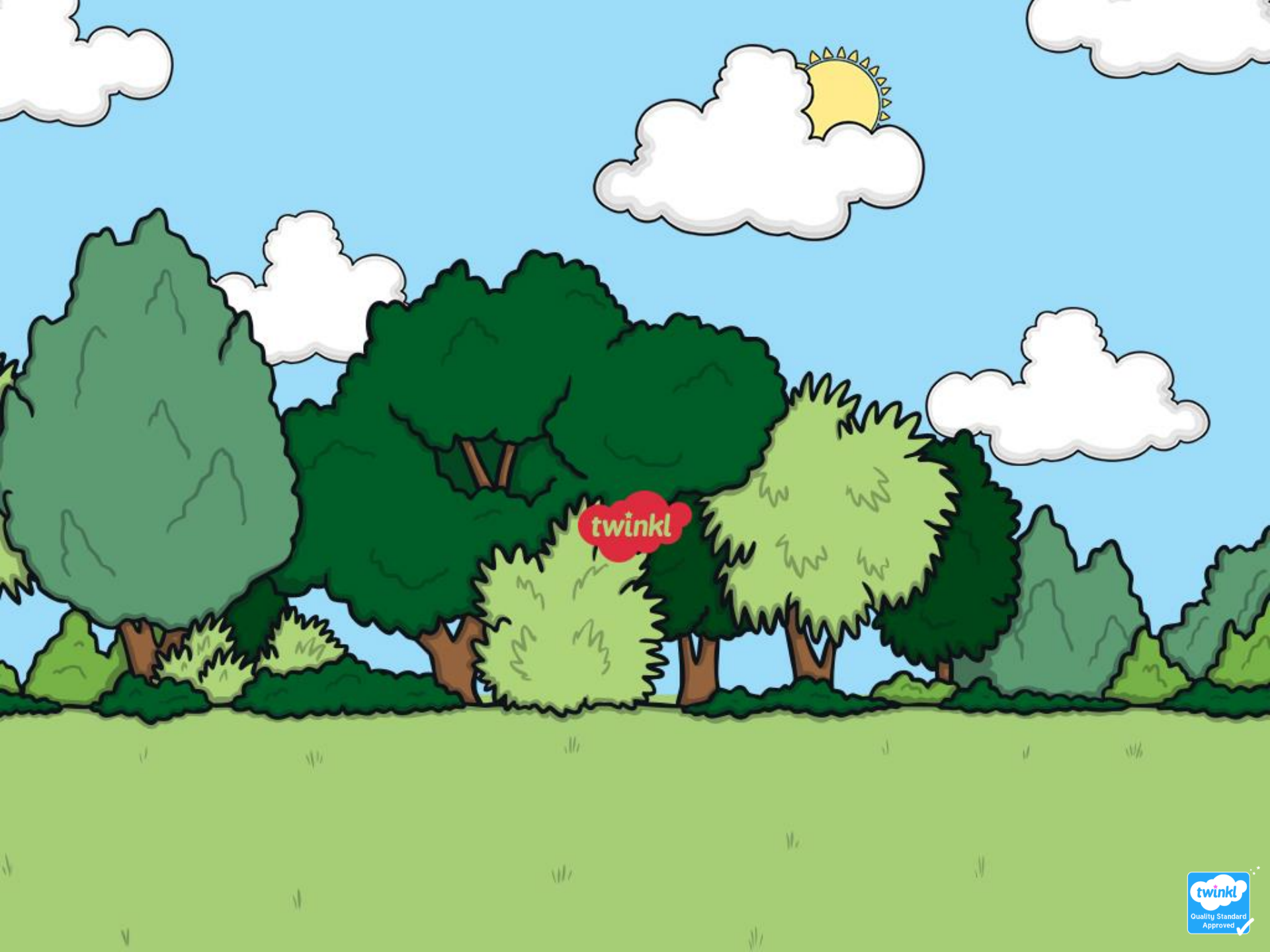
