Homework Deadlines: Monday 11th May and Monday 29th June. Choose one activity from the grid to complete for each deadline. You have around five weeks to complete a piece of work so take time to complete it as a project. A piece of writing is expected to accompany each piece. The topics below are just suggestions for ideas you could work on but feel free to research any aspect of the subjects we are learning in class.

<p style="text-align: center;">Sculptures An ART based project</p> <p>Create a sculpture inspired by nature, such as an animal, plant, or natural object. Use materials like clay, cardboard, paper, or recycled items to build your sculpture. Think carefully about shape, texture, and detail to make your piece realistic or imaginative. Once completed, explain what inspired your sculpture and describe the materials and techniques you used.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Shadow Investigation A SCIENCE based Project</p> <p>Investigate how shadows change throughout the day by placing an object outside in sunlight and measuring its shadow at different times (morning, midday, and afternoon). Record your results, including the length and direction of the shadow each time. Use your observations to explain how and why shadows change, thinking about the position of the Sun in the sky.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Illustrative Map A GEOGRAPHY based Project</p> <p>Create an illustrated map of Europe showing different countries and their locations. Clearly label a selection of countries, capital cities, and surrounding seas or oceans. Add drawings or symbols to represent famous landmarks, cultural features, or key characteristics of each country. Present your map neatly to show your understanding of European geography.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;">Purple Mash – Blog Post An ICT based Project</p> <p>Create a blog post using Purple Mash about a topic of your choice. This could be based on your learning, a hobby, a recent trip, or something you are interested in. Make sure your blog has a clear title, engaging introduction, and well-structured paragraphs. You can include images or fun facts to make it interesting for your reader. Remember to check your spelling and punctuation and write in a way that will keep your audience engaged.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">FIFA World Cup A PE based Project</p> <p>Create a PE research project based on this year's Football World Cup by choosing a country taking part and investigating key information about their team. Find out about the host country and stadiums, important players, and how the team prepares for matches. Present your findings clearly, including facts about fitness, training, and teamwork in football, and explain how this helps teams perform at their best during the World Cup.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">Memories! A Y6 LEAVERS based Project</p> <p>Create a "Year 6 Leavers Memory Project" all about your time at Langford Primary School. Reflect on your favourite memories, including special lessons, trips, friendships, and proud achievements. You can present your work as a poster, booklet, or scrapbook, including drawings, photos, or written paragraphs. Think about what made your time at Langford special and what you will remember most as you move on to secondary school.</p>

Week 5

Add your final touches! Finish any pictures or models. Ask someone to check it one last time - then hand it in knowing it's your very best!
