
Simile Reminder


A simile is a way of describing something by comparing it to something else using 'like' or 'as'.





The car was as fast **as** a cheetah

Why do we use similes and adjectives?

The dog was big and fierce.

Now if we add adjectives and similes...

The house was beautiful.

Now if we add adjectives and similes...

The black, scruffy dog was as big as a wolf and fierce like a very angry bear.

Isn't that better?

The ancient house was beautiful like an old fashioned painting.














Why do we use similes?

Blackcurrants

The succulent blackcurrants twinkled like inky pearls. Their burgundy, smooth skin as soft as silk. Like shimmering candle lights, the blackcurrants shone in the late afternoon light.





Carrots

The fresh, orange carrots lay like marigold flames. Their emerald fronds are like long, wild hair twisting and turning. Their bodies are as golden as the setting sun.
