Why Youlbury Scouts Camp?

- Distance - approximately 45 minutes away by coach.
- Minimum time spent travelling, maximum time for engaging activities, team building and exploring
- Facilities - equipment, accommodation, dining, utilities
- Range of activities offered
- Accommodation - spacious, new and able to provide single sex lodges
- Relevance to children's learning and links to the curriculum

What is included in the package?

- 1 night accommodation in 2 purpose built lodges - boys and girls will be accommodated separately.
- 2 days away
- Return coach travel
- 3 meal (dietary needs will be accommodated)
- Insurance
- Staffing
- 4 activities including an evening campfire

The Accommodation Lodges: Bear's Den & Centenary Lodge



- The lodges sleep 50 and 36. Both have a combination of twin rooms, two four-bed rooms, and four six-bed rooms. Every room has an en-suite with toilet, sink and shower.
- Beds are provided mattress-only, so make sure you bring a sleeping bag and pillow.
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- The building has a kitchen with everything you need to cater for the groups.
- There's a large main hall for dining or activities, with tables and chairs to seat your group. The main hall is equipped with a projector, screen and AV system for activities.

Activities

Your child will experience a range of exciting activities, some include:

Zip wire

Shelter building

Crate stacking

Campfire circle

Low ropes

Kit list - label everything!

Please arrive in school in suitable clothing for outdoor activities such as tracksuits, tshirt, hoodies, leggings

Please pack the following in a case or holdall:

- Coat
- 2 further sets of outdoor clothing.
- Clothing to wear in the evening (outdoor clothing will get dirty/damp so something they can wear at dinnertime and into the evening before bed)
- Trainers or walking boots for outdoor activities (old as they will get muddy)
- Pair of slippers, trainers or sliders for wearing in the lodges in the morning / evening.
- Pair of pyjamas / night clothing
- Hair ties for long hair - must have tied back for the activities
- Several pairs of underwear, thick socks
- Toiletries and a towel
- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Teddy or comforting item
- Torch or night light (battery operated)
- Book, comic, board games for down time / before bed.
- Large plastic bag to put dirty clothing in

Medical Information

- Only medicines which have been prescribed and have a prescription label can be administered by staff (this includes inhalers).
- Please ensure that when you complete the forms for this residential, that ALL medical information is given.
- The forms will need to be handed in advance of the residential so that Mrs Tomlin can complete the medical consent.
- Dates, timings and dosages of medicines etc **MUST BE MADE CLEAR.**

Other information

- ▶ Leaving school at approximately 10am and returning by the end of the school day on Wednesday.
- ▶ As with all things, the more prepared we are, the more successful an event it will be. We will try and accommodate as much as we can, but we will all need to be flexible and adaptable.
- ▶ We will be asking the children to list 3 children that they would like to either sit next to on the coach, share a room with or be a in an activity group. We cannot guarantee that your child will get all of their choices, but will be ensure that they will get at least one.
- ▶ If you have any questions which are specific to your child, please speak privately to the class teacher or send a get in touch to school.

Communication and Emergencies

- ▶ Day to day information will come via push notifications on the School Life app - this will include arrival, summary of the day, updates on departures.
- ▶ Any delays in our return journey will be communicated with you on School Life.
- ▶ First aid and emergencies: In the event of an emergency, the Leaders will have all contact details. School staff and centre staff are first aid trained and will administer minor treatment. We will inform you of these on our return. For emergencies and illness, we will contact you to collect
