

What does Music look like at Langford Village School?

Music is taught weekly in all year groups. Year 1-Year 6 have a weekly singing practise. The pupils learn songs linked to key festivals and events. A range of music genres are played during assemblies. Our choir perform for the school and local community. Children have the opportunity to play an instrument with the Oxford Music Service. Music at Langford Village is fun, practical and inclusive.

Why is it important?

At Langford Village we believe music plays an important role in children's development and helps children to feel part of the school and wider community. Music increases pupils' confidence and gives a sense of personal achievement.

What events take place?

Singing Assemblies, Phase/Year group performances, Nativity performances, participation in Young Voices, Choir visits to care homes, Choir performance at Christmas Lights 'switch on' in Bicester,

By the end of the Key Stage children will be able to:

EYFS. Sing a few familiar songs and use movement to express feelings. Begin to move rhythmically and be able to create movement in response to music. Tap out simple repeated rhythms and make up rhythms.

KS1 - Use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes. Play tunes and un-tuned instruments musically. Listen with concentration and understanding to live and recorded music.

KS2- Sing and play musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression. Improvise and compose music for a range of purposes. Listen with attention, appreciate and understand a wide range of music from different traditions and great composers. Use and understand musical notation/vocabulary.
