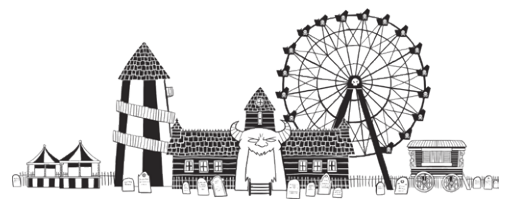


Word Classes
