<p style="text-align: center;">Communication and Language</p> <p>Children listen to stories, describe settings and characters, and follow multi-step instructions. They ask and answer questions, explain their thinking, and debate respectfully. Through play and group talk, they build confidence in storytelling, turn-taking, and expressing ideas clearly with peers and adults.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>Children solve conflicts through discussion, make healthy choices, and show growing independence. They confidently engage with others, tolerate delay, and enjoy responsibility. Jigsaw themes <i>Relationships</i> and <i>Changing Me</i> support emotional resilience, social awareness, and a smooth transition into Reception.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Physical Development</p> <p>Children refine gross motor skills through skipping, hopping, and balancing. They collaborate in team play and manage large equipment safely. Fine motor control improves through scissor use, pencil grip, and Dough Disco. They participate in Sports Day and explore movement patterns linked to music and rhythm.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Literacy</p> <p>Children build phonics knowledge and begin forming recognisable letters. They write their name, use symbols, and describe story events. Through mark-making and early writing, they express ideas, use print conventions, and tell stories with growing independence and confidence.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>Children count accurately to five, match numerals to amounts, and solve simple problems. They explore patterns, describe routes, and use positional language. Through play, they experiment with symbols and begin sequencing events, building early number sense and spatial awareness.</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;">Understanding the World</p> <p>Children explore forces, how things work, and changes in their environment. They talk about places, notice differences between people, and learn about countries and cultures through photos and discussion. Positional language and respectful curiosity support global awareness and inclusion.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Expressive Arts & Design</p> <p>Children create imaginative small worlds, explore texture, and join materials creatively. They sing, match pitch, and improvise songs. Artist studies (Shimamoto, Pollock, Goldsworthy, Thomas) inspire collaborative and nature-based art, while KAPOW themes like <i>Transport</i> and <i>Big Band</i> enrich musical storytelling.</p>
