

Year 4 Homework Menu Spring Term 2026

Homework Deadlines: Monday 2nd February and Monday 16th March Choose one activity from the grid to complete for each deadline. You have around five weeks to complete a piece of work so take time to complete it as a project. A piece of writing is expected to accompany each piece. The topics below are just suggestions for ideas you could work on but feel free to research any aspect of the subjects we are learning in class.

<p>History/ Design Technology An Anglo-Saxon based project</p>  <p>Create a model of an Anglo-Saxon house. Think about what resources you could use, such as cardboard, lollipop sticks or even Lego! Anglo-Saxon houses were typically simple, rectangular, single-room wooden huts with thatched roofs.</p>	<p>English A writing-based project</p> <p>The Anglo-Saxons used runes instead of letters. They carved them onto jewellery, weapons, and stones to show names, messages, or magic. Each rune had its own name and meaning, like 'joy' or 'ash tree'.</p> <p>Anglo-Saxon Runes The Anglo-Saxons</p>  <p>Create some runes of your own. You could paint them on paper, make them from clay or playdough, or design a poster on Purple Mash.</p>	<p>Design Technology An Anglo-Saxon based project</p> <p>Can you design an Anglo-Saxon shield? You could use physical resources or create this using Purple Mash 2draw.</p> 
<p>Music An instrument-based project</p> <p>Design and make a musical instrument – this could be using a shoe box and elastic bands, filling bottles with fluids etc.</p> 	<p>Computing A research-based project</p> <p>Research Fair Trade, what does this mean? where can we find fair trade goods?</p> <p>Fair Trade Poster – design a poster to encourage people to buy fair trade products. This can be done on paper or on Purple Mash.</p> 	<p>Geography A music-based project</p> <p>World's most unusual instruments – carry out research and discover the most unusual instrument you can find. Which country does it come from? Who invented it? Is it still used today?</p> <p>Create a poster or leaflet about this musical instrument. Include a picture of it and include some facts.</p>

Suggested weekly steps:

Week 1

Look at the ideas on your homework menu or think of your own. Read or talk about the topic to get inspired. Choose what your project will be about and how you'll show it - maybe a fact sheet, booklet, slideshow, model or even a short play!

Week 2

Start finding out more and write down some notes. You could begin a drawing or poster too.

Week 3

Keep researching and start writing your first draft using your notes.

Week 4

Ask a grown-up or friend to read your work and give you advice. Make it even better by checking your spelling, punctuation and sentences. Then write it up neatly.

Week 5

Add your final touches! Finish any pictures or models. Ask someone to check it one last time - then hand it in knowing it's your very best!
