You have around five weeks to complete a piece of work so take time to complete it as a project. A piece of writing is expected to accompany each piece. The topics below are just suggestions for ideas you could work on but feel free to research any aspect of the subjects we are learning in class.

<p>Feed the family A PSHE based project</p> <p>With help from an adult, plan a healthy, balanced meal for the family to enjoy.</p> <p>Go shopping to buy your ingredients.</p> <p>Cook up a storm!</p> <p>Ask your family for feedback, what did they like, what could be improved next time?</p> 	<p>What plants need experiment A SCIENCE based Project</p> <p>Set up a mini experiment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Try growing one plant with water and one without. Observe what happens after a few days. Record your results in a chart or drawing. <p>Question to answer: What did you find out about what plants need to grow?</p>	<p>Make a Pharaoh's headdress or collar HISTORY based Project</p> <p>Use paper, foil or cardboard to design and decorate a royal headdress or collar, inspired by Tutankhamun's treasures!</p> 
<p>Make your own papyrus scroll! An ART-based Project</p> <p>Create your own Ancient Egyptian-style scroll!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use strips of paper (or tea-stained paper) glued together to look like papyrus. Write your name or a short message in hieroglyphs. Decorate with Ancient Egyptian borders or pictures. <p>Extension: Add a sentence explaining what papyrus was made from and why it was important.</p>	<p>River Nile fact file A Geography based Project</p> <p>Research and create a fact sheet about why the Nile was so important for farming, travel, and daily life.</p> 	<p>Jazz legends! A music-based Project</p> <p>Task 1: Choose a famous jazz musician like Louis Armstrong, Ella Fitzgerald, or Duke Ellington and create a mini fact file.</p> <p>Task 2: Use simple household objects (pots, pencils, boxes) to make a rhythm pattern.</p> <p>Tap out a rhythm to go with a jazz song. Write down your rhythm using symbols. Perform it for your family!</p>

Week 3

Week 4

Ask a grown-up or friend to read your work and give you advice. Make it even better by checking your spelling, punctuation and sentences. Then write it up neatly.

Week 5

Add your final touches! Finish any pictures or models. Ask someone to check it one last time - then hand it in knowing it's your very best!
