A MATHS based project</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Go on a 2D and 3D shape hunt around your home or outside. • Draw or photograph at least 8 shapes you find. • Label each shape (e.g., <i>cube, sphere, triangle, rectangle</i>). • Create a shape tally chart showing how many of each you found. <p>Optional extension: Make a shape picture using only 2D shapes.</p>

Week 3

Keep researching and start writing your first draft using your notes.

Week 4

Ask a grown-up or friend to read your work and give you advice. Make it even better by checking your spelling, punctuation and sentences. Then write it up neatly.

Week 5

Add your final touches! Finish any pictures or models. Ask someone to check it one last time - then hand it in knowing it's your very best!
