




Homework Deadlines: Monday 2nd February and Monday 16th March Choose one activity from the grid to complete for each deadline. You have around five weeks to complete a piece of work so take time to complete it as a project. A piece of writing is expected to accompany each piece. The topics below are just suggestions for ideas you could work on but feel free to research any aspect of the subjects we are learning in class.

<p>WWII A HISTORY based project</p> <p>Use a history book or a safe website to find out what happened on D-Day (6th June 1944).</p> <p>Write short notes to answer these questions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What was D-Day? 2. Why was it an important turning point in World War II? 3. Which countries were involved in the D-Day landings? 4. What challenges did the soldiers face on the beaches? 	<p>Animals, Including Humans A SCIENCE based project</p> <p>For the next two days, keep track of:</p> <p>Everything you eat and drink What time you go to sleep and wake up</p> <p>You will use this information to think about how lifestyle choices affect the human body, especially the circulatory system, energy levels, and overall health.</p> 	<p>WWII A GEOGRAPHY based project</p> <p>Mark and label as many important WWII locations.</p> <p>For example:</p> <p>Normandy (France) – D-Day landings London (UK) – Blitz bombings Pearl Harbor (USA) – Attack by Japan Hiroshima and Nagasaki (Japan) – Atomic bomb targets</p> <p>Research and label as many locations as you can.</p> 
<p>Make Yourself Heard An ART based project</p> <p>Choose a topic or idea you feel strongly about. Examples: kindness, equality, protecting the environment, friendship, anti-bullying, or something that matters to you personally.</p> <p>On a piece of paper or in your sketchbook, make a rough sketch of your artwork. Think about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Symbols or images that show your message (e.g., heart for kindness, globe for the environment). • Colours that express emotion or meaning. • Style: abstract, realistic, graffiti-style, or a combination. 	<p>Dreams and Goals A PSHE based project</p> <p>Draw a picture of yourself doing your dream job in the future. Then write what inspires you to go into your chosen profession.</p> <p>You could draw yourself as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A doctor A scientist A teacher A footballer An artist A builder A vet <p>Or any other job you dream of!</p>  <p>Make your work colourful and detailed.</p>	<p>Islam/Sikh An RE based project</p> <p>How do clothing and appearance show religious commitment in Islam and Sikhism?</p> <p>Research and present what you find as a poster.</p>

Ask a grown-up or friend to read your work and give you advice. Make it even better by checking your spelling, punctuation and sentences. Then write it up neatly.

Week 5

Add your final touches! Finish any pictures or models. Ask someone to check it one last time - then hand it in knowing it's your very best!
