You have around five weeks to complete a piece of work so take time to complete it as a project. A piece of writing is expected to accompany each piece. The topics below are just suggestions for ideas you could work on but feel free to research any aspect of the subjects we are learning in class.

Create a poster or mini-booklet that tells the story of the Gunpowder Plot. Your project could include:

- A timeline showing the key events before, during, and after the plot.
- Images or illustrations of important figures and places, such as Guy Fawkes and the Houses of Parliament.
- An explanation of how Bonfire Night is celebrated today and how these traditions link to the events of 1605.

Living Things and Their Habitats



Create a project about a habitat and the living things that depend on it. Your project could include:

- Information about a habitat (e.g. rainforest, ocean, woodland, or pond).
- Plants and animals that live there.
- How they survive in their environment.
- A labelled diagram, map, or food chain.
- Interesting facts and illustrations.

World and Weather



Explore the world and discover how weather changes in different places. Your project could include:

- Information about a country or place of your choice.
- The different types of weather and climate found there.
- A map showing its location.
- Weather facts, symbols, or a forecast.
- How people, animals, and environments are affected by the weather.

Lost! Can You Help Find Him?



Create a lost poster for the boy from our book *The Way Back Home*. Your poster could include:

- A picture and description of the boy.
- Details of what he was wearing or any special features.
- Where he was last seen.
- Clues about his rocket and journey.
- A message asking people to help find him.

Use your imagination to create a poster that could help bring the boy safely home!

My Magical Map!



Design and create your own map. This could be based on a real place (such as your journey to school or a favourite location) or an imaginary world (such as a pirate island, fairy kingdom, or a land of dinosaurs). Your map should include:

- A key to explain the symbols you have used.
- Labels for important places and features.
- Creative details, such as landmarks, paths, buildings, or hidden treasures.

Leaders Who Inspire Us



Choose a leader who inspires you. This could be a religious leader or someone who makes a positive difference in their community. Create a fact poster about your chosen leader. Include:

- Information about who they are and what they have achieved.
- The qualities that make them a good leader.
- Examples of how they help or inspire others.
- Drawings or pictures of your chosen leader

Project Deadline:

Over the next few weeks, you'll be completing a homework project to be proud of. This is your opportunity to explore something that interests you, develop your ideas, and show your creativity and effort.

What to include:

- **Neat presentation** – Use your best handwriting or type your work if you like
- **Add something colourful** – Include a drawing, map, chart, or picture to go with your writing

Suggested weekly steps:

Week 1

Look at the ideas on your homework menu or think of your own. Read or talk about the topic to get inspired. Choose what your project will be about and how you'll show it – maybe a fact sheet, booklet, slideshow, model, or even a short play!

Week 2

Start finding out more and write down some notes. You could begin a drawing or poster too.

Week 3

Keep researching and start writing your first draft using your notes.

Week 4

Ask a grown-up or friend to read your work and give you advice. Make it even better by checking your spelling, punctuation, and sentences. Then write it up neatly.

Week 5

Add your final touches! Finish any pictures or models. Ask someone to check it one last time – then hand it in knowing it's your very best!
