General information

Thank you for supporting your children by saying goodbye promptly on the playground. Phonics Screening

Due to the Phonics check being cancelled in June 2021, Year 2 children will have their statutory phonics assessment at the end of the Autumn Term 2021. To support children with their phonics skills, we have daily Phonics sessions and some children have Phonics interventions throughout the week.

Accelerated Reader



Each child takes a STAR Reader test once per term to determine their ZPD (reading score.)

Children choose a book to read at school and home with the support of the class teacher and TA.

Children don't have to read every book in the level but need to read a wide range, and be scoring 85-100% on the majority of quizzes before they can move up to the next level.

Children should read on average 20 minutes each day to make maximum progress.

Once the child has read the book, they quiz the following day. For the younger children, we ask them to read the book twice so that they are more likely to score 100%.

Accelerated Reader



Children can quiz during the day, they cannot quiz at home.

Computers are always on AR homepage for children to quiz.

Aim is to get 85% or more on the quiz.

Teacher and TA to write down the score they got in their reading record and support them in choosing a new book.

Depending on how they have scored on their quiz will depend on how many points they achieve to go towards their target - if they get 100% they will earn all the points.

Targets get checked by teachers and adjusted when they reach the top of their flower.




